#### Principal's Report (Erin Paynter)

- Erin provided an overview of the OCDSB Strategic Planning Process and asked what three things
  would make a difference to support student learning and well-being. Ideas raised during the
  discussion included: additional teacher basics, returning to the basics, teaching about respect,
  communication, giving educators some power for accountability/restorative justice where
  respect is lacking, ensuring student voices are head and expectations understood, and zero
  tolerance on hate speech.
- Erin also discussed the plan for the Riverside South Secondary School and implications for Kars on the Rideau.
- Toonie Tuesday will be held on February 28, 2023, with students invited to wear their KOTR shirts
- Pink Shirt Day is Wednesday, February 22, 2023, and students are invited to wear a pink article of clothing.

## Vice Principal Report (Lara Currie)

- Sir Guy Carleton did a virtual presentation for Grade 8 students, and students were excited to see some of the trades available at the school.
- Kinder to Grade 4 had a "wills Jam" session with educational music. There was also a Love to Groove session enjoyed by students. Celebrate Africa also did a music presentation on a snow day, so all students attending school were able to participate. Little Red Theatre presented to younger grades.
- Ottawa Public Health presented to Grades 4, 5, and 6 on tobacco and alcohol awareness and the use of cannabis.
- Holocaust survivor Dr. Eva Olsen did a virtual presentation with grades 4-8.
- A Reboot Assembly for Grades 7 and 8 reviewed expectations with a focus on kindness and equity to ensure that KOTR is a safe and caring school.
- Snow Hawks skiing on Tuesdays has been exciting for students.
- A food drive is underway.
- Mr. Garrist is supporting Grade 8 course selection.

### Treasurer's report

- Treasurer reviewed the Treasurer report, the closing balance for February 17, 2023, was \$21,873,72.
- Funding of Grade 8 Festivities were discussed, including bussing for year end festivity, and the grad party.
  - \$1500 from the standing motion is to be split between the Grad Party and Trip (\$750 for each).
  - \$700 in funds allocated for bussing through the existing standing motion (\$5 per Grade 8 student) to be allocated for the Grade 8 trip.
  - o Council voted on \$550 in additional funding for the grade 8 trip.

Ani Sanchez brought forth the motion, which was seconded by Mark Pearson, and Council Members (), Leslie Pattemore, Vicki Arkinstall, Jennifer Kuyek, Mark Pearson, Shereen de Rosayro, Ani Sanchez voted in favour).

• There is a standing motion of \$400 each ear for the Coyote Trail hallway, council discussed the possibility of combining a mural with MASK (Community Art Group) to collaborate with Grade 8s as a legacy project for the school.
