Clarification on Cell Phone/Device Use in Grades 7 and 8

We wanted to clarify that according to the OCDSB updated procedure PR.622.IT - Appropriate Use of Technology (Students), we have adopted the K-6 standard to ALL our students, including students in grades 7 and 8. That means, the use of students' personal mobile devices is prohibited throughout the instructional day, except when their use is explicitly permitted by the educator. This was done in consultation with the school staff and the school Superintendent. Families had the opportunity to provide their feedback, and may continue to do so, with this form.

Concussion Protocol and Family Responsibilities

Every year, as part of our commitment to student safety, and to uphold the requirements of Rowan's Law Day, staff undergo yearly mandatory concussion awareness training.

We wanted to review how we approach the management of <u>concussions</u> at the school, as per <u>OCDSB PR.561.SCO: Concussion Management</u>:

- 1. When a student experiences a significant impact to the neck, face, head, or elsewhere on the body, the staff member who is supervising that student (i.e., teacher, coach, duty supervisor, etc.) will immediately stop the student from participating in the activity and undertake the OCDSB Tool to Identify to a Suspected Concussion to determine if the student is presenting any of the signs of a suspected concussion.
- 2. Where a concussion is NOT suspected but a possible concussion event was recognized, the student will return to learning the same day with no physical activity, and with continued monitoring at school and home for 24 hours. If after 24 hours of monitoring, no sign(s) and or symptom(s) have emerged, the parent/caregiver will inform the school and the student will be permitted to resume physical activities. Medical clearance will not be required.
- Parents/caregivers are notified as soon as possible if their child experiences a concussion event, and whether or not they are experiencing signs of a suspected concussion.
- 4. The student must be picked up at the school by a responsible adult.
- 5. When it is determined that a student is experiencing signs of a suspected concussion, parents/caregivers are required to seek medical attention that same day from a medical doctor or nurse practitioner (no other health practitioner qualifies under our policies and procedures) the student may not return to school until the medical doctor or nurse practitioner has determined whether or not the student is suffering from a concussion.
- 6. If there is a diagnosis of a concussion, the student **must** follow a medically supervised, individualized Return to Learn/Return to Physical Activity Plan.
- 7. If after seeing a medical doctor or nurse practitioner there is no diagnosis of a concussion, the student can return to regular activities with no restrictions.
- 8. Please see this <u>flowchart</u> for the stages and responsibilities of the school and the families when a concussion has been diagnosed.
- 9. According to this procedure, families are also required to inform the school if their child has been diagnosed with a concussion by a medical doctor or nurse practitioner due to an event outside of school hours, and the steps in the procedure will be followed. If your child is attending school and it is determined that they have a diagnosed concussion, a responsible adult will be required to pick them up until such time as a medically supervised, individualized Return to Learn/Return to Physical Activity Plan is submitted to the school.

Please carefully read all the information in the links above to ensure you understand the expectations for families. If you have not already, please ensure you have a plan that allows you or an emergency contact to be available to come to the school in a timely manner when you are needed.

Creating a caring and safe environment for our students is our top priority. Unfortunately, despite all reasonable precautions being taken, accidents can still happen. Some injuries may result in medical, dental or other expenses that are not covered by provincial health care or employer group plans and caregivers become responsible for these expenses.

The OCDSB does not provide student accident insurance. Caregivers are encouraged to consider purchasing accident insurance or student accident insurance for incidents that may not be covered by the Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) or any additional medical plans they have.

Student accident insurance is available for purchase on a voluntary basis. Caregivers may apply online at insuremykids.com or call 1-800-463-5437. The accident insurance coverage options range from \$17.00/year to \$33.00/year. All plans provide 24/7 coverage and a variety of important accident benefits (benefit limits differ based on plan selected). Reminder: Locks for Lockers

All students in grades 7-8, and some in grade 6, have lockers for their backpacks, lunch bags, etc. All students are required to have a functioning lock for their locker.

Please ensure your child has a lock, and we recommend having back-ups in case a lock needs to be cut off a locker (which happens when students forget their combination, or if the lock is malfunctioning and won't open).

September 19th is Powley Day

Powley Day is celebrated by the Métis annually on September 19th, the anniversary of the Supreme Court of Canada's unanimous ruling in The Powley Case (R. v. Powley). The Powley decision affirmed Métis harvesting rights, and was a momentous victory for the Métis Nation; it marked the beginning of a greater recognition of Métis rights in Ontario and across Canada. Métis people celebrate this legal victory that advanced Métis rights, and which continues to play an important role in the Métis struggle for visibility and independence.
